In Whom Do You Trust?

This year has been a wild ride, and it is still not over yet! One thing that I have learned during this extraordinary time is that the institutions that we normally take for granted are not always reliable. We can't always trust them. They are wonderful institutions, and we can depend on them most of the time. . . .but not all of the time! Let me give you some examples.

- 1. Health Care: We have the greatest health care system in the history of mankind. I am certainly thankful for it. In some places (like New York) it was stretched, but it never collapsed during the covid-19 outbreak. However, imagine if it had been worse. Imagine if the virus turned out to be much deadlier, and doctors and nurses were getting sick and dying. When you are sick and you show up at an over-crowded hospital with few doctors or nurses, you can easily imagine that you would be turned away with no one to help you. When you need health care the most, it may not be there for you!
- 2. First Responders: Again, we are blessed to have dedicated men and women who serve as police officers and firefighters to protect our community. However, when anarchist mobs descend upon our cities and overwhelm our first responders, you may be left to fend for yourself. The police may withdraw to protect their own infrastructure, but they may not have the manpower to protect you.
- 3. Education: Our schools may have their serious problems, but we are definitely thankful for the education that our children receive. However, Christian parents have long realized that our children do not receive a complete, well-rounded education in school. That is why you send your kids to Sunday School and AWANA! The most important lessons in life are not learned at the public schools. In fact, they are forbidden from public schools! Our education system may teach your kids how to read and write, but it will not teach them right from wrong. Actually, let me clarify that. Our education system will definitely indoctrinate your kids by teaching them right and wrong. But, their idea of right and wrong may be the opposite of God's standard of right and wrong. And, when there is a risk (such as covid-19), then the schools may not even be open for regular classes. What your children need the most, they will not receive at school. You can't always put your trust in our education system.

These are just a few examples. If we listed all of the things you should not trust, it would be a long list: politicians, journalists, scientists (I trust science, but not scientists!), justice system, technology, etc. When you really need them, they will fail you. In our study of the book of Revelation, that is exactly what happens. All of the man-made systems of the world collapse. They are unable to save anyone from the wrath of God. So, all of these institutions are indeed gifts from God to help us in many ways, but we cannot put our trust in them. In the end, God who gave us these institutions will take them away. Our only hope is in our Almighty God. In Him alone we trust completely, in all things, without reservation, forever. —Pastor


